

WIC income eligibility criteria

Effective April 1, 2007



WIC income guidelines are 185% of the most current U.S. Poverty Income Guidelines. These income guidelines are revised each year in the Spring. Please check with your local WIC office for the most current income guidelines once this sheet becomes outdated. This table is provided for your information only. The actual WIC income eligibility determination is done at the local WIC office. All applicants must bring proof of ALL household income to the local WIC office.

Total Household Income (before taxes and deductions) must be equal to or below the following amounts:
